1. What's Three Minutes Competition for Future Doctors?

Three Minutes Competition for Future Doctor is exciting opportunity for Ph.D. students to effectively explain their research in limited three minutes, in a language appropriate to a non-specialist audience. It aims to develop their presentation and research communication skills, while expecting broader society as audience to deepen positive understanding in doctorate resources/researches.

2. End-to-End Schedule



(1) Submit the Application Form

Please submit the attached Appendix 1 “Three Minutes Competition for Future Doctors 2016” Application Form”, together with your face picture in JPEG format (over 228W x 300H pixels), to HIRAKU Council Office in Tokushima (hiraku@tokushima-u.ac.jp) **by Monday, August 1, 2016**. It will be printed and publicized in a brochure to be distributed to all participants, including judges, presenters and audience.

We would highly recommend you to open your account at the Young Researchers’ Portfolio or “HIRAKU-PF” (<https://hiraku.hiroshima-u.ac.jp>), which allows young researchers and HIRAKU member organizations to exchange variety of information on each profile, events, internships, open positions and so forth. We would encourage you to update your profile/research achievement information in the e-Portfolio function in HIRAKU-PF in advance. Please refer to the Appendix 2 “How to open your account at HIRAKU-PF” for more details.

We might run the screening process based on the submitted information, depending on the number of applicants. Then we will determine the presenters by the selection meeting of August 2 (Tuesday).

(2) Submit Presentation Slide (Draft)

Please then send by e-mail the presentation slide you are planning to present at the Competition to HIRAKU Council Office in Tokushima (hiraku@tokushima-u.ac.jp) **by Monday, August 29, 2016**. Only **a single PDF slide in A4 landscape format** can be accepted for both submissions.

(3) Attend Pre-Training

B) Speech Training by Toast Masters Club (Optional)

You can take the speech training for free by Toast Masters Club, non-profit organization developing public speaking and leadership skills through practice and feedback with 332,000 memberships at 15,400 clubs in 135 countries (<http://www.district76.org/ja/>). You can join their activities at your nearest club once in September before the Competition. We would recommend this opportunity to those who want to receive feedback to your presentation from people in public. You need to pay any commuting expenses yourself to get the venue. Training method could differ by respective clubs at each region. We will send more details to each presenter later on.

(4) Submit finalized presentation slide

If you want to modify your presentation slide as a result of the above pre-training, please submit the finalized file to HIRAKU Council Office in Tokushima (hiraku@tokushima-u.ac.jp) at latest **by Tuesday, September 13, 2016**. You shall not be allowed to replace your slide after the due date.

(5) Three Minutes Competition for Future Doctors 2016

[Meeting Time] 9:00a.m. Saturday, September 24, 2016

[Meeting Venue] In front of the Small Hall at Kurara, Higashi Hiroshima Arts & Culture Hall

Presenters will receive commuting expenses based on the rules of Hiroshima University. We have secured a few rooms at the Toyoko Inn nearby the Saijo Station (which is close to the venue of the Competition). If you want to stay before/after the Competition, please inform HIRAKU Council Office in Tokushima when you send your presentation slide (draft) at the above step (2) due August 29. Once you submit the request to stay, please make the payment or cancel the reservation by yourself.

3. Rules of the Presentation

The following rules apply at the selection meeting and presentations at the competition.

- A single static **PDF** slide is permitted. No slide transitions, animations or 'movement' of any description are allowed. The slide is to be presented from the beginning of the presentation.
- No additional electronic media (e.g. sound and video files) are permitted.
- No additional props (e.g. costumes, musical instruments, laboratory equipment) are permitted.
- Take necessary care of intellectual property rights or any other legal rights of other parties to create a presentation slide. The source/attribution needs to be clearly indicated as necessary.
- Presentations are limited to 3 minutes maximum and competitors exceeding 3 minutes are disqualified.
- Presentations are to be spoken word (e.g. no poems, raps or songs).
- Presentations are to commence from the stage.
- Presentations are considered to have commenced when a presenter starts their presentation through either movement or speech.

You can choose headset microphone or hand-mic to use at your presentation. Please indicate your preference in the Application Form.

4. Judge and Awards

4.1 Judging Panel

Judging Panel consists of each President of Hiroshima University, Yamaguchi University, Tokushima University (or deputy officials), representatives from special sponsors, etc., who will determine winners of each Award listed in 4.3, following the Judging Criteria described in 4.2. People's Choice Award winner will be determined by audience' vote and certified by the Judging Panel.

4.2 Judging Criteria

Audience will cast a vote to one of the presenters, judging from the following criteria.

- Did the presentation provide the future vision and significance of the research to have the audience agree to them?
- Did the research description attract and excite the audience?
- Were the research outcomes new and surprising?
- Was the presentation easy enough for the non-specialist audience to follow?

Note: The selection meeting and Judging Panel will take into consideration all other perspectives than described above. (E.g. Did the presentation follow a clear and logical sequence? Was it well-balanced as a whole? Was the presentation slide effectively used to create synergy?)

4.3 Awards

We are planning to finalize Winner, Runner-up and People' Choice, as well as recipients of HIRAKU President Award and Sponsor Awards (Otsuka Award, Kyowa Hakko Bio Award, Chugai Technos Award, IBM Award, JSW Award, Mazda Award).

Please be noted;

- ✓ We are planning to finalize recipients of each award per section (Japanese and English), but we may combine the two sections for some awards.
- ✓ Rest of presenters will be receiving the Challenge Award (or Participation Award).

4.4 Prizes and Sub-Prizes

Each Award recipient will be given certificates, prizes and sub-prizes. Sub-prizes may include Lab-tour, Internship, Foreign Language Training, etc. Please fully leverage the opportunity to improve your communication and presentation skills, to develop your knowledge/competencies as well as to expand your network. We are also planning to send one of the presenters to 2017 Asia-Pacific 3MT Competition or Three Minutes Theses (3MT®).

5. Other Points of Attention

We may anticipate kind cooperation by the presenters to develop future Three Minutes Competitions for Future Doctors. We may also provide those presenters with various information on events/seminars associated with the HIRAKU program. We shall take the submission of your Application Form as your written consent to this clause.
